### **Longhirst Parish Association**

At its Board Meeting on the 20 March, the Longhirst Parish Association approved the wording of a new constitution for the Longhirst Parish Association to become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation. This will be formally registered with the Charities Commission during the next few months.

It was reported that our application to Northumberland County Council for planning and listed building consent for the various hoped-for developments, is still being considered. These include the replacement of the front windows with bespoke double-glazed units, built to look exactly like the existing ones; the removal of the plaster and cement rendering on the foyer walls and replacing it with ventilated timber wainscoting such as that which has been installed in the reading room, and the resurfacing of the rear car park. It was agreed that the like-for-like repair of the leaning chimney will go ahead in late May, or early June, undertaken by the firm of masons who rebuilt the Church Lychgate.

### **Residents Traffic Survey**

Thanks to everyone who filled in this survey. 105 people responded in just 8 days and added a total of 4500 words in the comments sections which clearly shows the strength of feelings about this. Here is just a brief summary.

Overall the impression is that the needs of vehicles are prioritised over the safety and wellbeing of pedestrians and residents. This is a particular concern as 30% of respondents described themselves as having an additional need (hearing/visual impairment, mobility, wheelchair/buggy user)

- 92% agreed or strongly agreed that they felt traffic travels too fast through Longhirst
- 83% agreed or strongly agreed that crossing the road in the village made them feel unsafe
- 96% agreed or strongly agreed that crossing the road at the church made them feel unsafe
- Only 10% said they had never had to walk in the road because paths were blocked by parked cars or overgrown vegetation
- 86% agreed or strongly agreed that they were discouraged from walking to and from the village or around Longhirst parish because of traffic, the state of paths or lack of paths beside roads.
- 56% of people who parked on the main street had experienced damage to their cars from through traffic
- 84% of people living near a main road said HGVs caused excessive noise or vibration in their home.

Issues which came up repeatedly were: the poor state of footpaths from the Longhirst Hall entrance, Pegswood and Longhirst Station; the lack of paths to Broomhaugh, Fawdon and towards Ulgham Lane; the lack of direct pedestrian access to Micklewood; the risk to pedestrians due to the speed of traffic along roads coming in to Longhirst from all directions; and difficulties for residents joining or turning off the main B1337 by car from side roads or entrances due to speed of through traffic. These issues were affecting residents' ability to take part in community activities and access to local facilities.

The comments also gave some idea of what traffic calming measures people felt were not working at the moment and suggestions of what could be done.

The next step is a petition to the county council to ask for their support for actions on the traffic issues in Longhirst. The petition will be available soon online and on paper.
