THE LONGHIRST LEADER CELEBRATES ITS 20th ANNIVERSARY

LEVEL CROSSING CLOSURE

Network Rail has announced that it will be undertaking major maintenance works alongside the **Station Road level crossing** at intervals from mid-August to the end of November.

There will be a few overnight crossing closures but there will be a **full closure of the crossing from 11pm on Thursday 15 to 9am on Tuesday 20 September**. The usual diversions will be signed.

Unfortunately, the timing coincides with the end of the harvest season and traffic problems can be expected between the centre of the Village and North East Grains for the duration of the daytime closure.

Both the Parish Council and NE Grains have requested a two-week delay to allow for the harvest to be completed but Network Rail has declined this request. They have promised to consult earlier in future but say it is now too late to alter their plans on this occasion.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



The last meeting of the Parish Council was held on 7 July.

Bill Dryden from **Longhirst Colliery** reported that the County Council had agreed to undertake the repairs to the potholes along Straker Terrace. The tree clearance following storm Arwen is still ongoing. The litter bin for the bus shelter has been ordered.

The Queen's Jubilee Picnic at the Village Hall was enjoyed by those who came (although it was not as well attended as expected possibly due to the proximity of the Open Gardens weekend). The Chair thanked everyone involved in the organisation of this event.

A **Queen's Jubilee Plaque** has been ordered at a cost of £154.99, however the location of the Jubilee tree and the plaque have yet to be decided.

The **houses on Dairy Lane** are nearly complete, one house is occupied and the other has been sold. Once completed vehicular access to the properties will be via Dairy Lane. It is expected that the gap in the wall of Longhirst Hall will be repaired.

Domino's Field - The developer has appealed the refusal of planning permission and the outcome is still awaited.

The Parish Council along with a number of residents objected to the planning application for an extension to the **Old Cricket Pavilion**. It is hoped that this will be the last application for the parkland at Longhirst Hall.

The problems with **fly tipping at Potland Park** have improved. The Environmental Enforcement Officer is in regular contact with updates on any remedial action taken. However, the access issues around public rights of way and the repeated flooding of the Ashington Road are still to be resolved.

The County Council has agreed to clear the **footpath along the Cricket club frontage** on the main road into the Village once the trees have been cut back to allow access for their vehicles.

A contractor has been appointed to carry out the repairs to **St. John's Lychgate**. Whilst as much of the original material as possible will be used some materials will need to be replaced including new roof tiles which will have to be made by hand.

The ongoing clear-up following Storm Arwen has delayed some of the requested repairs to the **Public Rights of Way**: never the less the County Council is committed to maintaining the paths.

Local Transport Plan. The Parish Council will submit just one priority - the resurfacing of the remainder of the Station Road from North East Grains to the Ashington Road junction.

Recent repairs to the **Longhirst Hall wall** near the old gatehouse - the Conservation Officer at NCC has agreed that the work is not of the required standard especially as the wall is listed. It is understood that they will be taking further action.

VICAR'S LETTER

Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And yet not one of them shall fall to the ground without God taking notice. Do not be afraid, you are worth far more than many sparrows." (A saying of Jesus).



One of my favourite stories from the Venerable Bede's "History of the English Church and People" shows the frailty of the humble sparrow being called upon to draw attention to the vulnerability of human life. Picture the scene. In the year 627 Edwin, the King of Northumbria, is sitting in counsel with his leading subjects debating with them whether or not to adopt the then "new religion" of Christianity and discussions are deadlocked until this decisive contribution:

"The present life of man, O King, seems to me, may be likened to the swift flight of a sparrow through the hall where you sit at supper in winter, with a good fire in the midst while the storms of rain and snow prevail outside. The sparrow, flying in at one door and then immediately out at the other, whilst it is within, is safe from the wintry storm; but after a short space of fair weather, immediately vanishes from sight into the dark winter from which it briefly emerged. So too, our lives appear for a short space, but of what went before or what is to follow, we are utterly ignorant. If therefore this new religion contains something more certain, it surely deserves to be followed."

That intervention won the day and Bede goes on to report of a huge christening service in York on 12 April, the same year the king "with all the nobility of the nation and a large number of the common sort received the faith and the washing of regeneration."

This past year since the churches have been opening again families are once more bringing their children for christening in very healthy numbers. When helping a family prepare personal prayers to be included in the service they are asked to write down what they are thankful for and what they worry about. More often than not they say that they are thankful for the safe arrival of their new-born but worry about the state of world their child has been born into and thereby give expression perhaps to that same vulnerability which prevailed in the debate at King Edwin's court all those centuries ago.

Did you know that the most often repeated instruction by Jesus and others in the Bible is simply, "do not be afraid" or "fear not"? In times of uncertainty and difficulty I often bring to mind a simple but wise saying which my vicar, from back in the day, had framed and displayed on the wall of his sitting room: "We struggle with anxiety and fear, not because we are ignorant of the future, but because we are ignorant of God."
